A Story to Begin - a Musical Story of Good Friday to Easter

Peter Lightfoot sent along this story to accompany the Prelude he shared:

"Nobuyuki Tsujii is a young, internationally-known blind Japanese concert pianist who composed this work in 2011 with the title "Elegy for the Victims of the Tsunami" with estimated 225,000 deaths, which occurred 9 years ago last month. We read the story a couple weeks ago of Jesus curing the blind - Nobuyuki in writing such a beautiful piece is an example of how all of us, being "disabled" in one way or other, can with grace rise to the exalted.

As an "elegy" is a lament for victims, I thought it was appropriate for now with the pandemic, but especially so for Easter with the first stanzas in the minor key (contemplative sadness of Good Friday), and the last part in the major key symbolizing the triumph of Easter Sunday. I added the ending three bells to remind that new life resumed after the 3rd day (as it will for us when we are out of our individual "tombs", however we interpret that word, whether pandemic-related or more generally)."
