Week 2 - April 25	Acts 17:16-24	Making the Unknown God Known In New Ways
	(Acts 18)	Paul's speech in Athens. (You can also read chapter 18 & 19 to continue the
		story of Paul visiting the communities at Corinth and Ephesus)
Week 3 - May 2	Acts 20	The Story of Eutychus: Who's sitting on our windowsills?
		Acts 20:7-12 (Additional reading: Acts 21 & 22)
Week 4 - May 9	Acts 23 - 26	Letters to the Church - What letters or messages of encouragement, gratitude, challenge might we offer to each other as 'church' during these days and months of pandemic isolation, restrictions and separation? These chapters tell the story of Paul's witness before the 'powers' of the day, his trials and imprisonment, and his transfer to Rome. It is believed that during these years Paul wrote many of his letters to the early churches, which we can read in the New Testament. (Romans, Corinthians, Thessalonians, Philippians, Galatians).
Week 5 - May 16	Acts 27 & 28	Headwinds, Detours and Open Horizons - Paul sails to Rome
Week 6 - May 23	Acts 2	The Spirit of Pentecost - Pentecost Sunday
