




Why have you not returned?




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Masking: Continuous masking for all over age 2 47 responses




Seating: Physical distancing between 'social bubbles'

Are you comfortable resuming Conversation Café after Easter?






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Limiting in-home visits by Minister except for emergencies 47 responses




In-home visitation from Minister upon request 47 responses






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Masking required for in-home visitation 47 responses

Doing ok but tired of Covid

Extend precautions until after Easter as we are still in flu/cold season

I am very uncomfortable will not be attending church I until Covid is more

I don't require masking in order to attend, but I would prefer it. I am continuing to mask at this time when outside of my bubble.

I am submitting this survey on behalf of Norma. She wants me to say that "she is fine with Shawn visiting anytime (with masks) and would also be ok with Pastoral Care Team members visiting with masks and other Covid precautions".



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We do not feel comfortable being unmasked or being around people who are unmasked at this time.

The average age of the congregation requires continued vigilance.

It is kind of a "wait and see" scenario right now. Lifting all mandates may result in another major outbreak and send us back to "red".

I will continue to wear my mask until I am comfortable without it. I am comfortable around people who are not wearing a mask. Pastoral care can decide to wear or not depending on the person being visited.

"No" to limit PC Team visits "for now"

For masking and distancing I'm more concerned about associating with school children. I'm very careful around my own grandkids and am more so with outsider children. No hugs?

I feel if someone was having Covid symptoms they would hopefully remain at home!! Government actions on Covid are political; there will be little info in the future on which to base predictions and rational policy. All we can do is live in the here-and-now, with me judging what's safe for me and my contact with others. On 28 March, I choose caution.

Isn't it premature to think we're "coming out of the COVID-19 pandemic" at this point? To remove all safeguards and protections seems unwise.

I feel it would be ok for the minister and Pastoral care Team volunteers to do home visits if the visitor(s) are masked and the person to be visited wishes to have them in their home. If the person being visited expresses the wish for social distancing, then that should be followed.

I would be okay if we removed our masks once seated, distanced, for the service, but back on for hallways, bathrooms, coatroom, and walking in and out of the Hub.
